makes it possible for individuals who are working or looking for employment to access work attire.



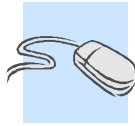
Dress for Success!

The clothing closet services individuals who reside in the Western Stark County

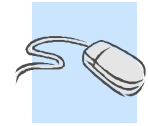
area and are unable to afford work apparel. This gives the employed, newly employed, or future employed individuals a clothing store experience.

During the shopping experience, a volunteer will assist the individual to obtain the appropriate clothing sizes. A clothing fitting room will be available to try on clothes.

The Working Clothing Closet is available by appointment only on Tuesdays and Thursdays with a case manager. Those seeking assistance are eligible to select three professional outfits, a pair of shoes, and accessories, as available, once every six months.



COMPUTER CLASSES



The Technology Center allows for a small group learning environment. Our handicap accessible building makes it easy for all to attend. All classes are taught by a volunteer instructor.

Adult Computer Classes are offered in our Technology Center. The classes that are taught include Introduction to Computers, Introduction to Microsoft Word, and Facebook. These classes are offered on Tuesdays and Thursdays, respectively, each class is three weeks long and is held once a week.

Certificate of Completion is provide to the participant once a course is mastered. Participants may attend all courses that are provided.

All classes are provided free of charge.

If you are not familiar with computers we encourage you to take the following classes in this order:

1. Introduction to Computers
2. Introduction to Microsoft Word
3. Facebook
